Stoute will return to Cedar Rapids where he coached the Titans from 2012-2016 and took a four-win team in 2012 to four-straight playoff appearances (2013-16) with an overall record of 40-17 in those seasons. He was named the 2013 IFL Coach of the Year and helped the Cedar Rapids franchise earn the distinction as the 2014 IFL Franchise of the Year.

Prior to Cedar Rapids, Stoute was the assistant head

coach and offensive coordinator for the Milwaukee Iron of the Arena Football League (2009-2012) who won the 2010 Midwest Division Championship with a 12-6 record. During his time in Milwaukee, Stoute played a pivotal role in rewriting the Iron and AFL record books while finishing #1 in the AFL in almost every offensive category.

As the assistant head coach and offensive coordinator (2005-2009) for the Green Bay Blizzard, while they were a member of the af2, Stoute helped the franchise to playoff appearances in five consecutive seasons including an American Conference Championship in 2006 and Arena Cup appearance. His responsibilities also extended into player personnel-related operations, where he helped place 45 players into the AFL and CFL over a three-year span as the team achieved a team record of 44-24. He also spent the 2007 regular season assisting the league with the Laredo Lobos franchise.

Stoute's AFL experience extends back to 1995 with the Connecticut Coyotes. He also spent time with the Charlotte Rage (1996), Florida Bobcats (1997-98), New England Sea Wolves (1998-2000) who later sold to an ownership group that made them the Toronto Phantoms (2000-02), the Indiana Firebirds (2003-04), and Tampa Bay Storm (2004-2005). He also spent 2002-03 with the af2's Mohegan Wolves.

Over the last two years, Stoute spent time with the Jacksonville Sharks of the AFL and NAL (2016-17). He was also with the Nebraska Danger of the IFL to begin the 2017-18 season.

Mark currently resides in Connecticut. He attended Kentucky State University in Frankfort where he majored in Business Management and Computer Science. He has been a member of the American Football Coaches Association since 1995 and during the Fall, works with an area High School football program.





MICHAEL CUSTER | ASSISTANT HEAD COACH



Michael Custer will return to Cedar Rapids, a place he called home for four seasons from 2013-16, to serve once again as a part of Mark Stoute's coaching staff and as the River Kings' Assistant Head Coach.

Coach Custer spent the 2017 IFL season as the offensive line coach of the Iowa Barnstormers and began the 2018 season, their championship winning year, on the staff before taking a leave of absence. Prior to joining the Barnstormers, he helped the Titans to four-straight playoff appearances and a 40-17 record. During his time in Cedar Rapids, the franchise earned the distinction as the

2014 IFL Franchise of the Year and Stoute was named the 2013 IFL Coach of the Year.

Stoute and Custer have a long history together that dates back to the 1980s during their time playing semi-professional football in Connecticut. After his collegiate career at the University of Buffalo and then professional playing career, Custer went on to coach in high school, college, and eventually in the arena and indoor football leagues.

JOEY SMITH | DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR



Joey Smith returns to the Cedar Rapids after a three-year absence to serve as the team's defensive coordinator for the 2019 IFL season.

In 2015 as defensive coordinator, Smith's defense gave up an average of just 50.3 rushing yards per game and limited opponents to 129.1 yards per game through the air. The defensive squads' effort went a long way in powering the team to a 9-5 regular season record and a United Conference Championship appearance.

After his time in Cedar Rapids, Smith spent time with the Jacksonville Sharks

of the NAL. The Sharks led the NAL in scoring defense (24.9 pts/game) and had the highest turnover margin in the NAL (+26, 2.17/game) in Smith's year as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator.

Smith spent 14 years at East Stroudsburg University in Pennsylvania before coming to Cedar Rapids in 2015. Prior to that, he had a short stint in the NFL. Smith returned kickoffs and punts and saw action at wide receiver and defensive back for the Giants from 1991-94. He was a defensive back and kick returner at the University of Louisville and played on the Cardinals' 1990 Fiesta Bowl championship team. Smith graduated from Louisville in 1991.

Dr. Dustin Arnold is an internist in Cedar Rapids, Iowa and is affiliated with UnityPoint Health-St. Luke's Hospital. He received his medical degree from Des Moines University College of Osteopathic Medicine and has been in practice for more than 20 years.

Dr. Arnold joined St. Luke's in 2006 and was named Chief Medical Officer/Chief Medical Information Officer in 2014. He is also Medical Director of the Wound Healing Clinic and Hyperbaric Chamber.

44 - Eric Banford **Defensive Lineman** 6'2" 275 Pounds Western Carolina

O'l ebanford

Banford is an arena football veteran. having played four seasons of indoor football returning to the Indoor Football League. Last season he started one and played in five games for the NAL's Maine Mammoths, recording 7.5 total tackles. He also played for the CIF's Amarillo Venom. starting in two games and recording ten


tackles and four sacks in just those two games.

In 2017 Banford played for the CIF's Duke City Gladiators. While in Albuquerque Banford played in seven games, earning 21 tackles (7.5 for loss), one forced fumble and recovery, and one blocked kick.

In 2015 he split time between Green Bay Blizzard and the Billings Wolves. Between his two teams he totaled 15 tackles, five sacks, three blocked kicks, two forced fumbles and one recovery. He also had an interception and earned Week 8 Player of the Week Honorable Mention.

Banford played his college ball first at Foothill College where he was a two-time All-NORCAL Conference member, recording 92 tackles (26.5 for loss) and 18.5 sacks in his two seasons there. He then transferred to Western Carolina, playing in every game and starting every contest his senior year. While a junior he recorded 25 tackles, and as a senior he had 28 and returned a fumble recovery for a touchdown.

Banford is a native of Newark, California, and went to Newark Memorial High School.



21 - Nick Brassell **Defensive Back** 6'1" 185 Pounds Ole Miss

The Indoor Football veteran is in his third season with the league and last season played six games for the Nebraska Danger in what was an injury-shortened season. Brassell (6'2, 185, University of

Mississippi) also returned kicks for the Danger; he had four kickoff returns for a total of 80 yards last year.

Defensively Brassell secured 18.5 total tackles (16 solo) last season. In addition, he also had five pass breakups on the year.

He was named IFL Special Teams Player of the Week in 2016 for his 57-yard touchdown return in week 11 of 2016, where he added three catches for 26 yards and another touchdown. He finished his night with seven returns for 190 yards.

In his rookie campaign, also with the Danger, Brassell played in all three phases in just five games. Brassell racked up 34 yards rushing on just two attempts, 83 yards receiving on eight catches for two touchdowns, and 14 kickoff returns for 296 yards with a long of 57 and a touchdown.

Brassell attended the University of Mississippi, where he also played in all three phases for the Rebels early in his career. He was second on the team in receptions, snagging 24 for 336 yards and a pair of

Brassell is a native of Mississippi, and attended South Panola in Batesville.



8 - Jeff Branch Middle Linebacker 6'3" 225 Pounds Presentation (SD)

Branch joins the River Kings for his first season as a member of the IFL. In 2018. he played for the Amarillo Venom of the Champions Indoor Football league (CIF) and earned Second Team All-CIF honors.

During his final two collegiate seasons at Presentation College (South Dakota),

Branch recorded 113 total tackles. In a standout senior season, he recorded 63 total tackles, 15 sacks, 18.5 tackles for loss, and forced six fumbles. He ranked first in the NSAA and NAIA in sacks per game [1.5], total sacks (15), and fumbles forced per game (.500).

When the Titans started, owner and general manager, Chris Kokalis chose Cedar Rapids because of the potentially fantastic market as well as a great place to grow the community around. The franchise committed themselves to the US Cellular Center, which was going through a revamp at the time. So for the 2012 season, the team decided that they would play out of the Cedar Rapids Ice Arena, used by the Cedar Rapids Rough Riders. For the inaugural Titans season, their choice for head coach was given to former AFL defensive lineman, Kyle Moore-Brown. Brown was able to coach this team to a record of 4-10, which included a win in their inaugural game against the Lehigh Valley Steelhawks. All four of their wins were won at home in the Cedar Rapids Ice Arena.

The Titans sophomore year ended much better than their first year. With first-year coach, Kyle Moore-Brown being taken over by Mark Stoute, future 2013 IFL Coach of the Year, the team was optimistic for the future. The team once again called the Cedar Rapids Ice Arena home as construction on the US Cellular Center was delayed.

The Titans took a step in the right direction by going 9-5 a big step forward since the prior year record of 4-10. Their record allowed Cedar Rapids to be eligible for the postseason for their first time in franchise history. Although the team did not make it passed the Sioux Falls Storm in the Conference Championship, the season was largely considered a success.

In 2014 the team moved into its current home, becoming a principal tenent of the US Cellular Center. This was a big move for the Titans because it brought in almost 50% more seating, capping out at 6,900. Mark Stoute would start his sophomore year of coaching Cedar Rapids and all eyes were on running back LaRon Council while defensively the Titans sported Xzavie Jackson, Pasquale Vacchio, and Ricky Johnson. On the special teams side, kicker Rockne Belmonte received five Player of the Week awards for his work on special teams.

This season was the best that Cedar Rapids fans have seen from their football team to this point. Their regular season record was 11-3, which would put them in the same position as the season before. Once again the Titans took on Sioux Falls in the conference championship game but with the same result as 2014.

In Mark Stoute's third season at the helm, the Titans were looking to break though with postseason success. Picking up 2014 IFL MVP, Willie Copeland, and led by Washau Ealey, second in the IFL in rushing, and Jermiah Price and Xzavie Jackson, first and second in the league in sacks, the Titans went 9-4 in the regular season.

Things ended there, as they had the previous two seasons, against Sioux Falls in the Conference Championship. a 34-12 loss against the now five time IFL Champion.

In 2017 Cedar Rapids brought in Marvin McNutt as head coach, replacing Mark Stoute and ending it's run of four consecutive seasons of making the playoffs. McNutt had a tough season, going just 1-15 in his head coaching debut

The Titans were led on offense by former Northern Iowa standout Brion Carnes, who still holds several franchise records for Cedar Rapids. Tre Parmalee and Damond Powell were second and third in the IFL, respectively, in receptions for the season.

The Titans turned to their second new coach in as many seasons, as former New York Jets linebacker Marvin Lewis took the helm for Cedar Rapids as McNutt was moved to a front office role. Lewis had some coaching expereince, working with the Brooklyn Bolts and was the defensive coordinator and interim head coach for the Colorado Crush.

Dispite only three wins, Cedar Rapids' quarterback Jake Medlock led the IFL in passing, going 265-421 (62.9%) for 2616 yards and 47 touchdowns. His top target was Marquel Wade, who led the league in receptions with 64 and was second in the league in receiving yards, with 793, just two yards short of the top spot.

This was the final season under owner Chris Kokalis, as after the season the franchise was sold to current owners Roy Choi and Matt Stone





IFL GLOSSARY OF TERMS

2019 RIVER KINGS MEDIA GUIDE

Alley - is the area bordered by the outside shoulders of the two offensive guards. The alley is established at the snap and does not move during the down.

Belt - is the area five yards beyond the defensive line of scrimmage. The belt runs sideline to sideline. The belt disappears at the snap.

Blitzer - the player who identifies himself to the offensive team and the officials as a potential blitzer by virtue of his alignment and raising his hand (if two linebackers are present in the box). He must be located in the alley, behind the defensive box at the snap.

In the Bank - means a penalty which cannot be administered on the kick-off, but will be enforced prior to the next from scrimmage. The half may not end with a penalty in the bank. In such cases, there will be an un-timed down.

Offensive Motion - in the Indoor Football League the offense is allowed to have two men in forward motion prior to the snap of the ball.

Scrimmage Kick Out of Bounds

A. If a scrimmage kick goes out of bounds through the receiving team's end zone it is a touchback, and it belongs to the receiving team at the five (5) yard line.

B. When a failed field goal attempt becomes dead in the end zone, it is a touchback and the ball belongs to the receiving team and is placed on the receiving team's five (5) yard line.

C. If a scrimmage kick goes out of bounds through the sideline beyond the receiving team's twenty (20) yard line, without touching the ground or a member of the receiving team, the ball belongs to the receiving team at its twenty (20) yard line.

D. If a scrimmage kick goes out of bounds before reaching the receiving team's twenty (20) yard line, the ball belongs to the receiving team at the spot it went out of bounds.

E. If a scrimmage kick goes out of bounds, through the sideline, after touching the ground or a member of either team and before possession is gained, it belongs to the receiving team at the spot the ball went out of bounds. F. If a scrimmage kick hits the ceiling, or any object suspended from the ceiling of the facility, the ball is immediately dead and it belongs to the receiving team at their twenty (20) yard line, or the receiving team may choose to have a re-kick. If a field goal or conversion attempt hits the obstruction, the attempt may be judged to be good if the Officials conclude that the attempt would have been successful in the absence of the obstruction. If the attempt is judged to be no good then the ball is spotted at the five (5) yard line.

Stunting or Twisting - When a defensive lineman is rushing the passer, there is no "stunting" or "twisting".

Rouge - a team is awarded one point for a rouge if any of the following conditions are met:

- 1) A rouge may only be scored on free kicks and is scored when a member of the receiving team is not able to advance a free kick out of his own endzone, or the player is declared down in their own endzone.
- 2) A rouge will be awarded to the kicking team if the receiving team commits a penalty in the receiving team's endzone and the ball has not been advanced out of the endzone.

Field Goal Posts - are ten (10) feet wide by 18-20 feet tall with the bottom cross-bar hung 10 feet above the ground. Field goal posts are hung from the arena ceiling.

Field of Play - game fields are 50-yards long with up to 8-yard endzones. The field is 28-yards wide and marked every five-yards with wall-to-wall lines. 12" hash marks begin five-feet from the center of the field.

Scoring - touchdowns are worth six (6) points, conversion place-kicks are one (1) point, conversion pass or run is two (2) points, field goals are three (3) points, a safety is two (2) points, and a rouge is one (1) point.

Overtime - there is no limit to the number of overtime periods. Each consists of a series by each offense.

Offensive Unit - eight (8) players will be active on the field during scrimmage consisting of three down lineman. Four playersmust be lined up on the line of scrimmage before the snap occurs. Two men can be in forward motion prior to the snap of the ball.

Defensive Unit - eight (8) players will be active on the field during scrimmage consisting of three down lineman. The jack-linebackeris not required to be in the defensive box. If he is, the blitzing linebacker must identify himself.


